

## **DAVID A. LOGAN**

**1940 –1943**

David Logan served as chief clerk under state Auditor Ernest E. Shannon and then went on to succeed Shannon during the Governor Keen Johnson administration.

Logan taught school and then worked in the Brownsville Deposit Bank. He served two terms as Edmonson County judge. He served as secretary of the Game and Fish Commission.

Logan was born into a prominent family and was a descendant of Col. Benjamin Logan, for whom Logan County was named in 1792. His great-grandfather was Marvel Mills Logan who served as a justice of the peace in Edmonson County for fifty years. Logan's parents were Gillis and Georgiana Logan, and they had seven boys and three girls. Logan was an authority on the history of his Logan ancestors.

Logan and his wife had five children.

Logan died at the age of 74 while in office. He was buried in a hilltop family cemetery in Logan County which overlooked the log house in which he was born in 1869.
