

SAMUEL H. STONE

1896- 1900

Samuel H. Stone, a Republican, was a prominent person in the lumber industry in Kentucky.

He was born on January 11, 1865, in Knoxville, Tennessee. His parents were Robert Matthews and Ann Bales Stone.

Samuel Stone attended school in Daviess County and worked in a sawmill in Owensboro. He later bought his own sawmill and continued in the lumber business for thirty years. He also operated a large farm and raised dairy cattle. In 1919 he was elected to the board of city commissioners in Owensboro and served several terms.

Samuel Stone married Mary F. Sherwood, of Shelbyville, on November 8, 1888, and they had three children.

Mr. and Mrs. Stone were members of the First Christian Church in Owensboro.
